What is a Pecha Kucha (Link)

The PechaKucha 20x20 presentation format is a slide show of 20 images, each auto-advancing after 20 seconds. It's non-stop and you've got 400 seconds to tell your story, with visuals guiding the way. PechaKucha was created in Japan in 2003 by renowned architects, Astrid Klein and Mark Dytham. The word "PechaKucha" is Japanese for "chit chat."

- Most importantly, our initiative is non-commercial, we produce this content to educate people and serve society
- Much of the content will be our own science, but of course there is often other people's work to cite. If you are not a co-author of that paper
 - o ask for permission to use material
 - o find similar material under <u>Creative Commons Licence</u>
 - in highly critical cases leave pictures or tables out and describe in your words their content (for the YouTube version, in our limited audience PechaKucha Online format you can still use them)
- If you are using your own content, but transferred all rights of material to your publisher
 - o make a small tweak to the image and use it or
 - o ask permission to use your own image as it is
